**PRC PROSECUTOR GENERAL YING YONG DELIVERS THE
ATTORNEY-GENERAL'S LECTURE 2024**

His Excellency Ying Yong, Prosecutor General of the Supreme People's Procuratorate of the People's Republic of China ("PG Ying") delivered the Attorney-General's Lecture today.

2 In his lecture titled "China's Procuratorial Work in the Course of Chinese Modernisation" ("中国式现代化进程中的中国检察"), PG Ying spoke on the evolution of the prosecutorial system in China, and how China continues to uphold the Rule of Law in a rapidly changing legal landscape amid the modernisation of China.

3 More than 500 participants from the legal community in both the private and public sector were present at the Lecture. Delegates from China and ASEAN who are in Singapore for the 14th China – ASEAN Prosecutors-General Conference were also in attendance.

4 This is the third edition of the Attorney-General's Lecture after a hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The previous run of the Lecture was held in 2018. Launched in 2016 when AGC marked its 150th anniversary, the Attorney-General's Lecture is a biennial event aimed at providing a platform for thought leaders in law and other related disciplines to share their experiences and insights with the public and private sector law practitioners and scholars in Singapore.
